

Up to 5 gallons or 25 pounds of household hazardous waste per vehicle may be accepted.

Materials we can take are:

- Household cleaners—ammonia, bleach and cleaners used for carpets, drains, toilets, furniture
- Lawn & garden chemicals—pesticides & herbicides
- Pool chemicals
- Aerosol cans and antifreeze
- Paint and paint products
- Solvents, strippers, turpentine
- Light bulbs - *NEW!*
- Non-lithium batteries - *NEW!*
- Wallover Oil returns this year to collect engine & transmission oils, brake & steering fluids

Materials we cannot take are:

- Commercial or business waste
- Mercury
- Asbestos
- Lithium batteries
- Compressed gases
- Explosives/Ammunition
- Medical/Infectious wastes
- Radioactive waste



Remember ... the Carroll-Columbiana-Harrison Joint Solid Waste Management District maintains two bins in town to collect nonhazardous household materials for recycling. They are:

Paper—newsprint, magazines, office papers & phone books

Glass—clear & colored

Plastic—soda & milk containers

Cans—aluminum & steel

If a container has any of these words, its contents may have ingredients that are corrosive, toxic, reactive or flammable. Right now these wastes can still be tossed in the trash or flushed down the drain.

BEFORE YOU BRING YOUR MATERIAL:

- Check all containers, making sure lids are tight
- Be sure all products are labeled
- Driver's license/photo ID required
- Except for used automotive fluids, all waste must be in original consumer packaging
- Pack in a sturdy container, lining it with newspaper or kitty litter
- Wrap leaking containers in clean plastic and pack in a container with kitty litter
- Do not mix different or unknown materials together
- Never eat, drink or smoke while handling these materials
- Drive carefully with the materials stored in trunk or truck bed
